With all other games that mattered complete and the scoreboard updated, all eyes turned to one match - Thompson v Solomons. Both sides were undefeated. From the Administrator's Desk

The past month has witnessed lots of events coming to their conclusion and the following is a brief description of these events.

BOJKOWSKI CROWNED CHAMPION: Haydn Bojkowski claimed his first Zone 2 Championship and the first win for East Maitland in the Zone 2 Men's Major Singles when he defeated clubmate Michael Abel 25 to 14. It was Bojkowski that had the better of the early exchanges setting up a five shot buffer which he improved on as the match progressed to grab the Title. Both players had hard fought semifinal victories with Abel winning 25 to 24 over Lee Schraner and Bojkowski getting the better of Matt Johnstone 25-22.

In the Senior Singles at Valentine, Peter Conlon (Hamilton North) was defeated by Warren Shipley (Soldiers Point) 25 to 11 in the Final to give Soldiers Point their first win since Nevelle Downes went back-to-back in 2007-08. Conlon led 4-0 before Shipley got back to 4-4, Conlon then led 8-5 but Shipley hit back to lead 14-8 then, with the scores 15-11 Shipley won the next four ends to get to the magic 25 and claim victory. Conlon defeated Windale's Mark Heath 25-23 in the semi, while Shipley defeated two-time winner Eric Ryan (Charlestown) 25-16.

Shipley's clubmate Tony Pearson made it a double for Soldiers Point and the third year in succession the club has won the Open Reserve Singles with Pearson defeating Glenn Baxter 25-20 at Mayfield West. In a hard fought battle, it was Pearson who edged away when the scores were locked at 20 a piece to score five unanswered shots for victory. Baxter won his way to the final with a 25-22 win over Craig Smith (Water Board) and Pearson defeated East Maitland's Stephen Coutts 25 to 15. All three title holders will head to Dubbo in March 2024 to contest the State Championships.

SCHRANER NAMED BEST IN NEWCASTLE: Raymond Terrace Superstar Lee Schraner was named the 2022/23 Newcastle Bowler of the Year at the Zone Two presentation night held early November. This award was for the season which ended in October after the completion of the National Titles in Perth. Schraner claimed the award after accumulating a record number of points for his achievements throughout last season finishing with a total of 47 points. Matt Baus is the only other player who has come close to that number in a season when he scored 40 points in the 2019 season. Schraner's outstanding season included winning the Zone Fours and finished Runner up at the State in that event. Winning the Zone Champion of Champions Fours and semi-finalist in the Zone Pairs. He also Won the NSW Champion of Champions Singles and Pairs and went on to win the National Champion of Champions Singles becoming the first player to do so on four occasions. Schraner also was announced as the Zone 2 Representative Player of the year being nominated by his fellow players as the best on the rink in six of the eleven matches played.

Also receiving awards on the night was Zoe Nicholls from Raymond Terrace who became the first female to win the Junior Bowler of the Year. East Maitland's Clay Parker received the Senior Bowler of the Year award and the President's award was shared between Fingal Bay club and team mates Stephen Sanders and John Kinsella.

Lee Schraner added another honour to his overflowing achievements when he was named the 2022/23 Bowls NSW Male Bowler of the Year at their awards evening. Schraner's efforts at State level included runner up in the State Fours, winning the Champion of Champions Singles and Pairs and he went on to win the National Champion of Champions Singles becoming the first player to do so on four occasions. Schraner's efforts contributed to his club Raymond Terrace being names NSW Club of the year taking out the State Grade One in both the Open and Men's Pennant competition. They also won the Open Grade Two and the National Triples in the Women's event. Soldiers Point's Vacie McIntyre was named the NSW female breakout bowler after a stellar 2022/23 season which included winning the State Senior Triples and Senior Fours.

BERESFIELD'S FOUR ON THE BOUNCE: Beresfield player

Mal Adams claimed the club's fourth successive Zone Two Minor Singles Title. In the fiftieth staging of the event it was Lambton's Steve Gilshenan who began best leading 4-1 before Adams won five of the next six ends to lead 11-5 before Gilshenan hit back winning the next four to trail by one 10-1, but Adams then picked up two doubles and a triple to set up a seven shot lead which he built on over the concluding stages to claim victory 25-16. Gilshenan was attempting to win Lambton's second title in the event, their only one being in 1979 while Adams joins clubmates Troy Barry, Peter Baker and Matt Brown to continue the Beresfield streak.

THREE THREES: Raymond secured their seventh successive title in Grade One last week when they defeated Beresfield 59 to 51. Belmont dominated the Grade Two final defeating East Maitland 82 to 34 giving Belmont not only their first title in Grade Two but also their first Title in any grade. Rathmines Memorial won the Grade Three Final with a 66 to 45 win over New Lambton at Edgeworth last Wednesday. In a dominate display the Westlakes Club led all the way to take the crown 66 to 45. The win was made more impressive as the Rathmines side were undefeated throughout the ten rounds of competition. New Lambton were striving to win the Club's first ever Three Threes Championship in any Grade, while this was the first Championship for Rathmines in Grade Three and it will sit along side the club's back to back victories in Grade Two in 1996 and 97.



CAN SPECTATORS SIT BEHIND THE RINKS? Law 45 requires spectators to be outside the boundaries of the green and away from players and that they must not disturb or advise the players in any way. The boundaries of the green include the ditches and the bank BUT not any surround or edging.

It could be argued that the area between the fixed seating and the green is reserved for players and therefore spectators are not allowed in that area - but this would have to be clearly signposted and announced before the event starts.

POSITION OF THE JACK ON THE TEE: Many players place the jack over the tee- this is incorrect the jack must be placed so that the front of the jack is level with the line on the tee.

MARKING A SINGLES GAME – GIVING ACCURATE ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS: Markers must answer accurately and concisely without giving more information than is asked for. At the same time, markers must be able to gauge what information a player is actually asking for. If a player asks a general question "Am I holding?", the answer is "Yes" or "No" or "It's a measure". If players ask for the position or situation, they are asking for more information than simply whether they or not they are holding. They will want to know whether they are up or down and by how many. Whilst giving this information the marker should anticipate further questions about the relative position of bowls to the jack and be ready with answers without a further extended visit to the head. Avoid frustrating and time wasting exchanges such as : "Am I holding one?" – No - " Am I holding two?" -No - "Am I down one?" -Yes – "How many?" – One.

THE MORAL FOR THE PLAYER IS - IF YOU WANT ALL OF THE INFORMATION ASK "WHAT IS THE POSITION".

NEW LAW. Players and Umpires should be aware that in the 4th Edition of the Law Book the following Law has been included in relation to "Playing out of turn"

29.1.4 If a bowl has been played by each team or player in Singles before the players discover that one of them has played out of turn, play in that end must continue in that order.

That's all for 2023 – Have a great Christmas.



COACHES TIPS ON DELIVERY

The secret to a smooth delivery is rhythm and timing, keep the backswing slow, smooth and relaxed. Let the weight of the bowl lead you into your delivery action. This should eliminate any form of jerkiness or of you trying to steer the bowl rather than bowling your bowl along your intended line. Lock your wrist

outwards and your bowling arm and elbow straight and this will automatically tuck into your side to avoid round arming.

The co-ordination of the lead foot stepping out the backswing of the arm will flow of it's own accord. As the bowl drops away, so also will the body drop down into the delivery position smoothly.

The length of your step depends the position of the jack on the green. A short jack means a very small step, a medium length or ³/₄ length jack requires just medium length step and a full length jack requires a normal or long step. All these steps will control the length of your backswing, and if you roll short of the jack, you lengthen your step to add to length to the jack.

The step also controls the momentum of the bowl, with the arm straight back and then straight through the delivery line. Your weight will automatically transfer forward from the anchored foot to your lead foot as the arm and bowl travel through the centre point of your delivery position. The non-bowling hand should rest on your knee for both support and balance.

After the bowl has left your hand on it's way along the chosen aiming line, do not forget to complete your delivery follow through.

Palm to the heavens, your head remaining very still, then when the bowl has travelled a small distance from the mat, slowly become erect with the anchor foot coming forward to the lead foot and watch your bowl come to it's full stop.

Don't ever step backwards or you will step on a bowl and do yourself and injury.

Good luck, good bowling, see you in the next edition.


