A fantastic effort from both players. Lee now has 1 gold and 2 bronze WORLD C of C medals. Remember to get to the World Championships, he has won the AUSTRALIAN C of C Singles a record three times. What a champion!! Congratulations Lee.

At the other end of the bowls spectrum is us. We had our first game at Raymond Terrace Blooms The Chemist Mixed Pairs on Monday 21st November and it went as well as could be expected for a first time. We got ABOSULTELY SMASHED 30/5!!! STATE FINALISTS DECIDED: On the Weekend of November 5 and 6, across 20 venues State wide, qualifying matches were contested in the State Mixed Pairs to advance to the State Championships next July. Locally both Valentine and Kurri Bowling clubs hosted sectional play on both Saturday and Sunday to whittle the field down to 3 teams from each venue. At Valentine, after winning through their sections on the Saturday, it was Mark Greene and Melissa Witts (Soldiers Point) claiming section 1 with 2 wins +19. Section 2 was won by Adamstown's Deb Barber and Greg Coote with 2 wins +15, while Raymond Terrace young guns Zoe Nicholls and Brendan Stokes took out section 3 with 2 wins +14. At Kurri, also advancing from Saturday, it was the Telarah pair of Cheryl Cook and Daniel Hoffman getting through their section win a narrow win and a draw with a +2. In section 2 the Beresfield duo of June Evans and Grant Boyce were successful with 2 wins +15 with a narrow 1 shot win in match 1 and in section 3 the Raymond Terrace pairing of Lynne Thompson and Chris Garn advanced with 2 wins +18. These section winners will join 26 other mixed pairs teams at the State Championships at a venue yet to be decided, where again they will compete in sections of 4 with 8 section winners advancing to knockout Quarters, Semis and Final.

JETS CRUISE TO VICTORY: The Raymond Terrace Jets have claimed their 2nd Men's Zone Championship for the 2022/23 season when they coasted to victory in the Zone Triples. The Jets team of Jamie Minter, Ian Lean and Shannon Gittoes blasted away from the Beresfield team of Tony Atcheson, Kevin Roberts and David Wayland from the start of the match and led 24-4 at the halfway mark of the final winning 10 of the 1st 13 ends and 14 of the 22 played to take the final 32-11. This gives Minter his 2nd, Lean his 3rd and Gittoes his 1st Zone 2 Triples titles.

BACK-TO-BACK FOR SOLDIERS: Defending Champions in the Senior Triples, Mark Sheppard, Bill Ahoy and Mick Beesley (Soldiers Point) claimed the title over Charlestown's Sam Laguzza, Kim Jaques and Eric Ryan 25 to 17 in the final at Beresfield last Saturday. The Soldiers trailed 7-0 after 3 ends and 12-5 after 11 ends before fighting their way back into the match to draw level 15 all after 18 ends. The Soldiers then put their foot down over the next 6 ends to outscore the Tigers 10-2 and claim their back to back titles. Hopefully the trio will avoid illness this time when they travel to the State titles and not have a repeat of last year when Mick Beesley fell ill to the dreaded virous the week of the State Champs

RIDD LAST MAN STANDING IN RESERVES WIN: Cardiff's Cohen Ridd combined with 2 new partners in the Semi-final and Final at Mayfield West to secure the Reserve Triples Championship over Jamie Carr, Steve Cruickshank and Glen Woods (Soldiers Point) 28-16. Ridd's previous teammates Neil Smith (illness) and John Mackenzie (Travel) were both unavailable with club mates Robert Peattie (sub for Smith) and Paul Jones (replacement for Mackenzie) getting the job done to claim the Championship. In the semi, Cardiff defeated Beresfield's Wayne McCarthy, Peter Baker and Mal Adams 33 to 16 while Woods team defeated club mates Allan Austin, Keith Hurley and Ted Nunn in a thriller 21-19. The word on the street is that Neil Smith, who is a constituted member of the team, will be "unavailable" for the State Championships, allowing Robert Peattie to compete in the State Finals.

STATE PENNANT FINALS: Zone 2 and Region 5 and 6 clubs headed to various parts of NSW on the weekend of November 18, 19 and 20 to contest the Men's and Women's State Pennant Finals. In the Men's Division 1 played at Port City and Lake Cathie, Raymond Terrace had drawn Westport, Cabramatta and Merrylands in their section winning all their 5 matches for a battle against Warilla in the Final where the Jets hung tough and although losing in 2 of the 3 rinks that finished 1 shot victors over a very strong Warilla side to claim the State title 61 to 60. The rink of Jamie Minter, Ian Lean, Michael Smith and Matt Baus proved the difference winning 26 to 18 over the Warilla rink skipped by Aaron Teys. Shaun Richards, Lachlan Freeman, Shannon Gittoes and Lennon Scott fought back against Gary Kelly to record a narrow 2 shot loss 18-20 while Tim Twining, Brendan Stokes, Josh Bell and Jason Stokes, although defeated 17 to 22, were the last to finish and knew what they had to do over the final stages of their match against Cory Wedlock to secure the Title. the Jets hung tough and although losing in 2 of the 3 rinks that finished 1 shot victors over a very strong Warilla side to claim the State title 61 to 60. In Division 2 Men's held at Cabramatta the Hamilton North side drew Dubbo, Campbelltown and Alexandria Erskineville in section 2 and the Hornets finished top before being defeated 62 to 42 in the Quarter Finals, while Kurri Kurri ladies had drawn Greenlees Park and Armidale in section 4 at Taren Point and although all sides finished with 5 points each it was Kurri with the best margin and they went on to claim the flag with a 43 to 23 win over the locals Taren Point. Tea Gardens drew Gwandalan, Grenfell and Camden in section 3 of Division 3 Men's played at Dubbo and finished 3rd in their section. The women's division 3 played at Bomaderry where Beresfield in section 1 were drawn against Mosman, North Haven and the Hills District and they also finished 3rd in their section. In Division 4 Tea Gardens had again qualified and they headed to Warilla where they drew Ettalong, Miller Park and Tathra Beach in section 3 where Miller Park finished 1st and Tea gardens finished 2nd with these 2 clubs winning their way through the Quarters and Semis to again meet in the Final where Miller Park again proved too strong winning 67 to 46 but Tea gardens did claim 2 rinks and the ladies side from Belmont had local knowledge when they took on Seaforth, Young and Cabarita Beach in section 2 played at Valentine with other sectional matches played at Marks Point. Belmont 2nd in the section but were defeated by Narrabri 48 to 33 in the Quarter Finals.

At the time of print Lee Schraner was leading his section in the World Champion of champions Singles in New Zealand. I will report on the event next issue.

As the men's pennants was only a six game event (with covid plus some bad weather) Tea Gardens entered teams in Division 3 and Division 4. With ten sections of four teams in Division 3 and 12 sections of four teams in Division 4 there was plenty of competition for the Zone 2 flags.

Division 3 had a must win last game "washed out match" to get into the zone play-off, and in Division 4 it came down to winning against one of the strongest club in our area (Raymond Terrace Bowling Club) to advance into the zone play-off.

Division 3 played at East Maitland and Division 4 at Beresfield over two days, each game was a must win to progress to the finals, in the end it was an amazing and historical feat for Tea Gardens Bowling Club to win TWO Newcastle and District Bowling Association Pennant Flags in the one season.

And so on to the Bowls NSW State Pennant Finals, Division 3 went out to Dubbo and Division 4 headed south to play at the prestigious Warilla Bowling club just south of Wollongong. To come back crowned as a NSW State Champion in either Division would be a once in a lifetime dream come true.

But first they had to play a series of elimination matches against some of the best sides in the State

to challenge for that heady prize.

The games began on Friday with each side expected to play two matches each day until eliminated. Division 3 started well with a good win over Gwandalan 71-55 in their morning game but fell 5 shots short against Grenfell in the afternoon 71-76. Similarly, Division 4 managed a good first session win accounting for Tathra Beach 74-41 and in the afternoon succumbed to Miller Park 51-60. This meant that both sides had to win their Saturday morning games to progress to the quarter finals. At this level of competition, every shot counted and Division 3's hopes were dashed when they

Though Tea Gardens won two of the three rinks, Miller Park's third rink had a runaway win taking the Masterboard 67-46 and the Bowls NSW Pennant Division 4 Flag. Tea Gardens runners-up.

Both Divisions, sponsored by our local First National Real Estate, played their hearts out and deserve the sincere congratulations of all of us in the bowling fraternity.

Congratulations also to our Management Committee, who somehow found the funds to send the two sides off on their quest, the sole Selector, Peter Gurney, who did an amazing job and our home base the Tea Gardens Country Club, who keeps us bowling every week.

The Club will be holding a "Dolphin Day", commemoration early next month and this will be combined with the raising of the three Pennant title flags from the mast head.



ONLINE LEARNING PLATFORM, BOWLSLEARN: Bowls Australia recently launched its Online Learning Platform which is a new national self-paced learning platform titled **BowlsLearn.** This platform has been unveiled to increase the capabilities and reduce the barriers to coaching and officiating.

BowlsLearn is seen as a complementary product to the sports existing training and development and **will not** replace the current face to face training courses which is the current method we use to Accredit new, Markers, Measurers and National Umpires.

I understand that to be eligible to do the course on line it is a requirement that you purchase a copy of the Law Book and a copy of the Bowls Australia Officiating Manual.

COST OF COURSES

The online courses for Marking, Measuring or Umpiring are free of charge **however** the online learning course **does not** cover the "On the green Training and Assessment sessions" which are to be completed by participants once the online course has been completed. This will be organised by Bowls NSW once the following payments have been made to Bowls NSW; Marker - \$22, Measurer - \$22, Umpire (which includes the Marking and Measuring modules) - \$50.

FACE TO FACE COURSES.

Members of the NDBA umpires Committee who have been Accredited by Bowls Australia to conduct courses will continue to conduct courses in a face-to-face environment, they will also conduct the "On the green Training and Assessment sessions" as required.

REACCREDITATIONS.

These will still continue to be done in a face-to-face environment.

Hi Dreamers and welcome to December and a merry Xmas to all, I hope Santa fills your stockings with Toucher Spray, new Bowls shoes, a measure and maybe even a new wheelie bag!

This month I come to you with 3rd world problems and how we are going to line up the bowling boundaries between Men and Women. So here is the problem, in the area that Zone 2 covers sits all of the Newcastle (NDWBA) and Lake Macquarie Ladies (LMDWBA) districts and a little bit of the Ladies Hunter River District (HRDWBA) to add further complications, as it stands now Newcastle, Hunter River and Upper Hunter Districts come together as Region 5 to playoff for State qualification and Lake Macquarie challenge Central Coast in Region 6 for their State places. Now Central Men and Women have the same boundaries so unification for both Men and Women on the Central Coast is pretty straight forward but I am hearing they will want straight qualification to the State events for their ladies, which is fair enough, but where does that leave Lake Macquarie? The clubs that throw a spanner in the works are Beresfield and East Maitland as the Men compete in Zone 2 where the Women play in the Hunter River District of which the majority of clubs are situated in Zone 6. So do the women come across to Zone 2 or do the Men go to Zone 6? What complicates this is that East Maitland was in Zone 6 roughly 6 years ago but applied to BNSW to link with Zone 2 which was granted. Once you sort out that little issue the next is playing off for State spots as currently between 5 women's districts which then go into 2 Regions for 2 State positions but if Central Coast want their own stand alone State spot that only leaves 1 spot for LMDWBA, NDWBA, Hunter and Upper Hunter which doesn't seem very fair. What the answer is I do not know but BNSW have announced the following:

Quote: "The Board of Bowls NSW is pleased to announce that a Boundary Working Party has been formed with the primary purpose of working on the alignment of Zone, District and Regional boundaries. At the Strategic Forum held earlier this year, Zone and District representatives highlighted boundary alignment as a major focus point that needed to be addressed. Bowls NSW has listened to the comments provided by our Zone and District representatives and formed a Boundary Working Party to begin this important

The subject of boundary alignment between Zones, Districts and Regions has existed for many years, and previous attempts to resolve the issues associated with it have been made by both the former Women's Bowls NSW and Royal New South Wales Bowling Association.

As a unified association, Bowls NSW is eager to have the Boundary Working Party consult with Zones, Districts and other key stakeholders to identify and address the key areas of concern relating to boundary alignment. Bowls NSW will create a dedicated email address for the Boundary Working Party which will be made available in due course, and we look forward to working with members throughout this process." End Quote:

Alive one day, dead the next

On November 4 I, along with 22 other aged gentlemen went off on "Travelling Bowlers" from Soldiers Point BC to Gunnedah, departing early Friday morning. These travelling bowlers' trips go to different towns in the NSW country, usually to the West, where we play a couple games of bowls and add to the economy, by adding to local club's bar and food sales.

Gunnedah, has been hit fairly heavy by the recent floods and it was well received them when we hit town. It was a pleasure as well as a bowls lesson to play against the local members, especially when we were beaten by three children under 15 years of age. Great to see they just did not sit around playing with their I Pads

After a successful weekend we bid good bye to Gunnedah boarded our bus at 13:30 and we were off down the Oxley Hwy heading home, nearly all of us with sore heads, must have been the long sleep. Through Blandford, onto the New England highway and then it hit the fan around 15:30...

Most of us were either reading or snoozing, when I noticed a blue SUV pass us at high speed, followed closely by a Toyota land cruiser Ute, then everything for me slowed down. The SUV veered in front of our bus too close and attempted to move into the passing lane, sideswiping the Ute. The Ute in turn veered across the road hitting the back of an Audi A4 going north, next thing the A4 is under our bus, bits and pieces flying everywhere. Our wonderful driver reacted brilliantly turning hard left at probably 100 kms/h. Whether it was bloody good luck or Devine intervention, our bus flew across a culvert, because of all the wet weather recently our bus should have rolled over, but instead it sunk into the mud. Let me tell you, Newton's Third Law was there at the time. We stopped, but everything loose in the bus, like phones, bottles, arms, legs and heads passed me at 100 kms/h. Most of us old farts are on blood thinners, so everything that hit us made us bleed, the inside of the bus looked like a slaughter house. The dust settled and with the motor still running, there was shock, mates injured and lying in the aisle our first thought was fire, let's get out. So, at 18:00, near 3 hours after the bang, some of us who were ok, were taken to Scone Bowlo, that club stayed open to feed and give us a drink. One of our team was taken by Helo along with the A4 driver to John Hunter, another two from the bus to Tamworth Hospital and six were ferried by ambulance to Scone hospital, 13 of us were picked up by a bus at Scone to arrive home a 22:30. It was all over the news, yet no one would know of the terrific work the police, firemen and Ambulance do under difficult conditions.

bowl, the bowl and Jack should finish close together. Having perfected this rhythm, the player should then be able to apply a little more or less weight in the Jack and bowl to various lengths irrespective of speed of the Green.

Once the bowler has achieved the natural rhythm of Jack and Bowl, the practice then goes on to delivering one Jack and one Bowl to all various lengths. It is suggested that these Jacks not be set on the centre line but played to wherever they finished when rolled, this is good practice for it sharpens a bowler's capacity to read a Green.

If the bowler can occasionally arrange a friendly game with an opponent, you will find this practice worthwhile playing for a set number of ends or to a time limit is also a good idea.

It must be remembered that in Singles play, the first two bowls are normally used as draw bowls, particularly the first. The third and fourth are used for positional or recovery Bowls.

With "Set Games" having been introduced to competitions these are also good practice games.

"SINGLES PLAY"

While some bowlers are not good team players, they can be excellent Singles competitors. There is a valid reason for this because in a team match they are burdened with thought that they might let their fellow players down. No such anxiety confronts them in a Singles match, where the only person to be let down is the individual player.

To gain confidence,



bowlers who would like to specialize as Singles players must practice for many hours to achieve the consistency required. Consistency breeds the confidence necessary to play the correct shot at the right time and the required concentration to prevent outside elements from interfering with its perfect execution. A good temperament is also essential in the making of a champion.

The practice needed for a good Singles player or a good Lead is designed to develop a natural rhythm. The first step in achieving this begins with delivering hundreds of Jacks. If a player is going to practice on a medium paced Green it is suggested that the Jack is delivered to a three-quarter length. Develop a natural rhythm to accommodate this length and being able to deliver at least 10-12 Jacks all within a half- meter of each other. Effectively when the Bowler is on a slower running Green about 12-13 seconds - the natural rhythm of the player will deliver a short end. To play on a 16 second green the length of the natural rhythm will be about full length. Every accomplished bowler knows that if a player can deliver a Jack with a rhythm and uses the same rhythm delivering a

90 YEARS STRONG

RAYMOND TERRACE BOWLING CLUB

From her humble beginnings in winning the Raymond Terrace Novice Singles in the same year she contested her first U25 State Singles at only 14 years of age and was selected in the Junior Country team. Her talent and consistency saw her debut with the Australian Jackaroos in 2010 and she has since notched up 372 international



games for Australia. Natasha now lives in Port Macquarie but for the past three years has travelled to play Championships and Pennants for the club – that is loyalty!! In her speech Natasha thanked the club and all of the people who have had an influence in her life during her bowls career with Raymond Terrace.

Members and guests had the pleasure of dressing up for a black-tie evening to celebrate the very special occasion of Raymond Terrace's 90th Anniversary. 90 years is a lot to cover, but Chairman Brett Gleeson did a great job. Below is a slightly abridged version of his speech.

"The club was founded the same year the Sydney Harbour Bridge was opened back in 1932 when the average cost of a new house was \$6500, the average wage was \$1650 per annum, average new car cost \$610, average monthly rent was \$18 and the cost of a loaf of bread was 7 cents. Agallon of petrol cost 10 cents... that 4.5 litres for 10 cents... a bit over 2 cents per litre. Amongst other interesting tidbits such as the year Bodyline was introduced in cricket and the year Pharlap died, for me personally it was the year my father was born.

In 1932, Raymond Terrace was a small community of around

850 people. **15 March 1932** – there was a meeting chaired by the mayor which resolved to form a club to be called the Raymond Terrace Bowling Club on the motion of Mr E Windeyer and seconded by G Sutton. A committee was then formed with the President being Mr E Markey.

The first green was laid down by Mr. Henry Richard Sutton in Glenelg Street.

9 April 1932 – Lady bowling members approved to be admitted and the Ladies' Committee was formed with

President J B Meredith and Secretary/Treasurer A E Osborn. End of April 1932 – Club membership had reached 27. On the 27th May 1932 the Sydney Morning Herald reported the expansion of the Clubs' facilities with a six-rink green and on 26 November 1932 Raymond Terrace joined the NDBA.

In June 1946, the club secretary (Mr Hammond) wrote to the Council requesting 'the council erect a club house on the green site as the club was unable to entertain visiting teams when they played at Raymond Terrace and it was making it difficult to arrange a continuity of games. Also the ladies were desirous of again joining up. The council asked the club to furnish more particulars.'

Consequently, Jacaranda Avenue (formerly Stockton Street) became the new home for bowls, previously a football and cricket field.

Sometime later - the Raymond Terrace Golf Clubhouse at Boomerang Park was moved to Jacaranda Avenue to be the Bowls Clubhouse. This clubhouse would eventually move to the Hunter River Park to serve as the Aquatic Club.

In 1969, land at the back was purchased from the WaterBoard to erect the number 3 green. The clubhouse has been regularly upgraded and expanded in 1950's, 1964, 1997, 2010 and most recently 2017.

The cover green known as the sails were officially opened in November 2007.

Us as a bowling club: From modest beginnings, the club has successfully fostered the game of bowls, laying solid foundations that have been continually enhanced.

It was reported in the Raymond Terrace Examiner and Lower Hunter and Port Stephens Advertiser on Thursday 18th July 1946 that 'the bowling green was in better condition now than at any other period in its history and ranked equal to the greens in Newcastle district. And in 1948 the club added a 7th rink to its green as the membership had grown from 30 to 42.

Clearly the club and the game of bowls became entrenched in the Raymond Terrace community from those early days.

The club won its first pennant in 1974 – the NDBA No. 6 Grade Flag and six years later in 1980 the 4 grade men's team won the clubs (and possibly only) state pennant flag. 1985-86 the ladies won both the 3 Grade and 4 Grade District Pennants.

The club has continually won male and female District Pennant flags over the past few years and has also been state runner up in both mens and ladies multiple times.

In the ensuing 90 years, since our humble beginnings, the club has been established as the number one club in the Newcastle District and currently has a solid upward trajectory towards a state pennant flag. I'm confident that it's not far away, with TWO teams contesting State Playoffs. Our strength is our depth and our capacity to attract quality players to the club.

The club can respectively boast numerous past and current District, state, and national representatives, both male and female, including juniors, senior and bowlers with a disability.

In my relatively short time at the club, I recall Australian singles winners being Natasha Van Eldik, Matt Baus and Leeroy Schraner. And for Natasha, multiple gold medals at two Commonwealth games. An amazing achievement that as a club we are indeed very proud of.

What I find exciting about this clubs' current achievements, is the breadth and depth of our successes. Apart from Natasha, Matt, Leeroy, Genevieve Delves, Kate Matthews we also have bowlers like Sharon McReynolds (senior ladies), Michelle Campbell (Disabilities), Zoe Nichols (Junior), and many others competing and representing this club at state and national level.

I want to acknowledge 2 very critical decisions this club has made, which have both contributed significantly to our success. The first is the decision to be the first club in the southern hemisphere to have covered synthetic greens. This decision set this club apart and beyond all others and created a trend that many have followed, for the betterment of the sport of bowls.

The second decision was the establishment of the Jets Junior academy. Promoting, fostering and nurturing young bowlers has helped create the depth of our playing ranks. The junior academy has produced top players and champions and will continue to do this. I also want to acknowledge our staff and volunteer members who run the academy along with partners, especially the Marketplace Shopping Centre with Colleen and her team providing valuable sponsorship.

Now to the future: So this club is now poised for an exciting future. From a business prospect we are strong, we have a committed Board of Directors partnering with a strong management team to move the club to the next level.

The clubhouse as we now know it will be substantially changed and updated. This auditorium will become the gaming area and the functions area will be over in the southwest area. The catering options will be increased to at least 3, there will be an outdoor alfresco area and activity area for children. The only entrance will be via port Stephens Street with an elevator bringing our members and visitors from a new reception area to the first level. This is stage one, which we hope will be started about this time next year.

Then there will be 2 further stages, firstly to integrate the bowling area with the clubhouse with new fully enclosed greens that connect seamlessly with the clubhouse. This enhancement of the greens will position the club to host District, Zone, State and hopefully national and even international tournaments. We will also be creating our own tournaments to attract visitors to the club.

The final component is a multistorey motel with a restaurant and functions area on the top storey above the current grass green. The area will capture the incredible sunsets and the mighty Hunter River. This will complete the package, our business model for the future, the next 20 to 30 years."

CONGRATULATIONS Raymond Terrace on your 90 years. It certainly sounds like the club has a clear future planned and will continue to go from strength to strength.


