Raymond Terrace also celebrated a milestone with their  $90^{\text{th}}$  Anniversary on  $22^{\text{nd}}$  October. More on this next issue – unfortunately we don't have the space to do it justice this issue.

It's been a long wait but Lee Schraner will be contesting the WORLD Champion of Champion Singles in New Zealand this month – good bowling Lee.

The Nationals were played in October and I am happy to report that Claire Kelly and Shannon White (Forster) won their section and contested the gold medal match in the Australian Mixed Pairs Championship and were defeated by the slimmest of margins 12 shots to 11 to take home silver medal. Sarah Boddington has

claimed the bronze medal in the Australian Singles Championship with a 25-2 win over ACT's Chloe Morrison. And to top it off Michelle Campbell brought home GOLD in the Multi Disability B5-8 women's pairs with teammate Jo Hunter. Congratulations to all these players!!!

In the Australian Sides Championship the NSW Women's Blues finished top of the table and the Men placed second!! Men's Senior Division came third and the Senior Womens side placed fifth. Combined, this gave NSW the OVERALL honours at the first Australian Sides Championships since 2019 and their third consecutive overall victory. Great bowling and well done to all of the representatives from our readership.

During this event Nathan Dawson notched up 50 games for the State. Nathan has been a consistent top-class bowler since his days in the Juniors. His return to the State side since his debut in 2005 was long overdue and we are so very proud and happy for him. I did a bit of a search on my computer to try and pinpoint some of his successes, and was blown away with the sheer number of documents his name appeared in. I subsequently let it go due to overwhelm, but needless to say he is right up there with the greats in our readership. His name is engraved on the Darby Ross Singles Trophy a record 8 times, has been the Hunter District Bowler of the Year at least 7 times and was Bowls NSW State Bowler of the Year in 2019. Congratulations Dawso!

In this issue we have the Region 5 Women's Single Gender Pennant teams who have won their way through to the State Play-offs. Zone 2 men also have their contenders and are featured in the centrefold. Whilst Zone 6 have been finalised, we are awaiting a photo of the 1 Division which we should have before the next edition and will showcase them together. In the meantime, good luck to all contesting the State Play-offs from Zone 2, 6 and 11 in the men's as well as the women's Region 5 and 6. They will be spread across the state contesting from November 18 – 20.

The weather has been a constant concern for organisers this year, with many postponements and cancellations turning the lushest heads of hair thin and grey. Unfortunately The Beith Shield at Marks Point was yet another casualty of the weather but we did get to grab a "before" pic with the contestants sipping their "wee dram" that is a tradition prior to heading out for their first game. ### IGURAL MEN'S PENNANT DECIDED.

RAYMOND TERRACE CONTINUE THEIR DOMINANCE: The Raymond Terrace Jets have again proved they are the benchmark of Zone 2 with a dominant display in the Division 1 playoffs. The Jets cruised to victory in both their matches defeating Charlestown 88 to 38 and Soldiers Point 65 to 31. In their 1st match against Charlestown Lennon Scott won 28-10 over David King, Matt Baus defeated Daniel Hill. 28-14 and Lee Schraner was too good for Eric Ryan 32-14. Against Soldiers Point they again claimed all 3 rinks with Scott defeating Warren Shipley 22-14, Baus over Gavin Kelly 16-9 and Schraner 27-8 against Terry Antram. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> match of the Round Robin fixture it was Soldiers Point defeating Charlestown 69 to 44 with Shipley defeating King 24-19-6 Kelly over Hill 25-9 and Antram over Ryan 20 to 19. The Jets next challenge will be the State finals where they have drawn Zones 5, 10, 12 and 14 in their section at Lake Cathie commencing November 18.

HAMILTON NORTH REALISE POTENTIAL: The Hamilton North Hornets recent recruitment drive has been fruitful with the club securing the Division 2 Flag over Teralba. The Hornets defeated Raymond Terrace 62 to 43 in the Quarter Final and Lowlands 93 to 35 in the semis while the Teralba Mullets had a 70 to 29 win over Boolaroo before defeating Warners Bay 68 to 49. In the final it was Hamilton North that got off to a flyer to lead by 20 mid way through the match but Teralba fought back to level the master board at 43 all but it was the hornets who finished stronger winning 54 to 51 with the Hornets Mark Evans winning by 1 over Greg John 18-17, Teralba's Neil Brace got over Mick Brown 18-12 but the win by Ryan Steel over Jarrod Duncan 24 -16 proved the difference and earnt the Hornets a trip to Cabramatta for the State Finals where they have drawn Zones 4, 5 and 13.

TEA GARDENS DOUBLE CELEBRATIONS: The coastal town of Tea Gardens are probably still partying after they were successful in winning both the 3 and 4 Division Men's Pennant. In Division 3 they had to do it the hard way and win a qualifying match on Saturday morning claiming a 66 to 47 win over Soldiers Point with Greg Brown leading the way with a 28 to 14 rink win. This set up a quarter final clash with Lemon Tree Passage and it was Dennis Ashbridge's 20 to 8 rink win that set up 60 to 47 victory. In the semi final Tea Gardens took on Bar Beach who had a 64 to 40 win over Teralba in their quarter final match and although Craig Eades had a 25 to 14 rink win over Greg Brown this was countered by a 28 to 16

win by Tea Gardens' Cody Ross over Greg Johns and it was Tea Gardens claiming a 67 to 65 victory. In the other semi it was Windale Gateshead that cruised to a 75 to 43 success over Charlestown winning on all 3 rinks. In the Final Dennis Ashbridge had a 20 all draw with Windale's Rex Draper and even though John Synott scored a 19 to 16 win for Windale it was again the Tea Garden rink of Peter Gurney, Ron Barczelly, Scott Fitzalan and Cody Ross proving the difference with a 29 to 16 win to secure the Flag 65 to 55.

In Division 4 the Tea Gardens side again had to win through a qualifier defeating Lambton 77 to 40. Beresfield were the quarter final opponents and although Garry Pickett grabbed a 20 to 16 win for Beresfield, Tea Gardens were too strong winning overall 65 to 48. Meanwhile

Hamilton North had won their way to the semi with a 73 to 53 win over Nelson Bay and 62 to 52 over Valentine but the Tea Gardens Dolphins were too hot for Hornets with an 82 to 52 victory. In semi final 2 it was Adamstown winning their way to the final with a 73 to 47 result over Kahibah but Tea Gardens would again prove too strong to claim their 2nd Flag 66 to 44. The Tea Gardens Club will now contest the State finals at Warilla for Division 4 for they have drawn Zones 6, 7 and 15 at Dubbo for Division 3 drawing Zones 4, 5 and 15.

Lee Schraner will head across the ditch to contest the 2022 World Champion of Champions Singles at Naenae Bowling Club, Wellington, New Zealand from November 19 to 26. This event has not been contested since 2019 due to COVID and it was Schraner who was victorious in that year as well and he endeavour to become the 1st bowler male or female to be back to back winner of this most prestigious event.

PAT GEARY SHIELD: The World event in NZ will make Schraner unavailable for the Pat Geary Shield to be contested between Zones 2, 6, 11 and 14 at Forster on November 26 and 27. The Zone 2 selectors have still named a formidable line up with 4 players to make their Open debut. Paul Russell (Soldiers Point) will register his 1st cap when he lines up as 2nd for Daniel Hill (Charlestown) who will have Matt Johnstone lead and Warren Shipley 3<sup>rd</sup> both teammates of Russell's at Soldiers Point. Scott Thoroughgood (Charlestown) has been entrusted to guide the other debutants in club mate Caleb McDermott and Raymond terrace Duo Brendan Stokes and Lachlan Freeman. Shannon Gittoes (Raymond Terrace) will be in charge of club mates Shaun Richards and Ian lean along with Beresfield's David Govan while Matt Baus (Raymond Terrace) will skip Daniel Clarke (Soldiers Point), Jarrod Duncan (Teralba) and club mate Lennon Scott.

It's a great innovation, but naturally met with queries regarding the BA policy on using electronic devices on the green. But that's a minor detail which can easily be fixed to welcome technological change. The game was also livestreamed for all to see.



# WIEWPOINT

# A COUPLE OF INCIDENCES I OBSERVED WHILE WATCHING PENNANT PLAYOFFS OVER THE WEEKEND THAT COULD HAVE COST SHOTS.

- During measuring a player removed bowls before his opponent had agreed on the number of shots. Law 22.2 states "A bowl must not be moved until the opponents have agreed whether it is shot or not, except where a bowl has to be moved so another bowl can be measured". Law 37.1.4.2 states "If a bowl at rest or a toucher in the ditch is displaced by a player and it has disturbed the head after it is displaced, the **opposing skip must** put the bowl back to its former position and replace any part of the head disturbed after the displacement". The player who disturbed the head CANNOT question where the opponent places the bowl/ bowls in question.
- During measuring a leaning bowl fell. Law 23.6.1 states "If a bowl is likely to fall, either opponent can use the best available means to secure it in its position". Law 23.6.3 states "If a bowl falls of its own accord, it must be left in its new position while deciding the number of shots scored continues, and all of the shots agreed before the bowl fell will count". This is why all thirds should carry a chock to secure any leaning bowl during measuring.

### MARKING TOUCHERS.

Law 15.1 states "A toucher **must** be marked with **chalk** by a member of the team that delivered the bowl or the marker as soon as it comes to rest". A stick of chalk, a chalk spray or a chalk pen all meet this requirement. **The texta type pens used by some players are not approved and must not be used.** 

Law 15.2 covers the situation where if a toucher comes to rest in a position in which marking it would be likely to move the bowl or alter the head, the bowl must not be marked but nominated as a toucher instead.

Law 37.4.1 covers the situation where if a bowl is displaced by a player when marking it as a toucher, or by the equipment being used by a player during measuring, an opponent must place it back to its former position. There is no law which states that a bowl cannot be touched while marking it as a toucher.





### "THE PLAYERS THE TEAM"

Arrival early by all members of a team or an individual in singles, at the Club where members are to play is an essential part of Pennants and Tournaments. It can be stressful for those players who turn up to play when roll up is called and one member is missing. Player's concentration will waive if one player leaves it to the last minute to turn up

at a venue. If playing away from your club, it is advisable to travel in one car to avoid this if at all possible. To arrive early has a lot of advantages one is you can relax, have a drink, something to eat, meet old friends or the opposition, time to have a roll up together and some players talk strategies.

In Pennants the Skip may have new players in his team due to changes, he may ask how they want questions answered so as not to reveal the position of the Head which is in your favour.

All Skips are different, some play to a Leads strength which may be long ends or short ends, he may want a few ends and he gets to know the strengths and weaknesses of his own team players and the opponents. The third should only speak to the Skip if the Head changes or if the Skip asks questions Skip will earn the confidence and respect of the Team if he treats them with the respect they deserve.

During the game the Skip may dictate to the Lead to length he may need to upset the opposition this should be done

without any question. The Skip may also change the length if the opposition  $2^{nd}$  continually regains the shot after the Leads have finished playing their Bowls.

The Skip has got to learn the strength and weaknesses of the opposition as quickly as possible so that their team can control the game.

Continued criticism of a player's bad bowls doesn't help but will most times undermine confidence and have a psychological effect on the player and the rest of the team's performance. Fears and phobias will also have effect on some players so don't let a noisy player on the adjoining rinks upset your concentration. Try not to let the drawing of the ditch rink upset your concentration. A good skip should make sure that when continually shifting the mat to shorten or lengthen the ends, it doesn't upset the concentration of the whole team.

Should the day become cloudy, try to erase the thought of rain or wet conditions from your mind and put all your concentration on the game because the Green may slow in pace or may become quicker depending on the surface being played on.

### "The Cohesiveness"

The team as opposed to the individual poses' different problems for Coaches, Managers and other athletes. Sharing and developing a support system produces a more integrative and flexible team than a group on "individuals". However, it has been stressed that while a family concept needs to develop, individuals need to preserve their own personalities.
