SCHRANER CLAIMS QUADRELLA: Lee Schraner has claimed his fourth Australian Champion of Champions singles title at Sorrento Bowling Club in Western Australia last month. Schraner won five of his six matches to top the table as the only five game winner from the seven state champions from across the nation. The Raymond Terrace superstar first won this event in 2017 and went back to back to also win in 2018, his next triumph was the 2021 event which was played in 2022 due to Covid and this latest win will see Schraner represent Australia at the World Champion of Champions. Schraner's only loss was in round one where he was defeated 21 to 14 before winning his next five matches 21-11, 21-18. 21-7. 21-20 and 21-5.

SOLDIERS GRAB STATE TITLE: I was lucky enough to be partnered by Terry Antram (Soldiers Point) and we lifted the shield in the State over 40's Pairs championship last month. We won all three of our sectional matches before edging out Peter Foster & Shaun Johns from St. Johns Park with an 18-16 victory in the quarter final, then defeated Nathan Dawson & Simon Mitchell of Club Maitland City with a decisive 19-5 victory before taking the final over the formidable opponents, Tim Cavanough & John Hills from Corrimal, with a final score of 19-14.

MATTARA NOW COMPLETED FOR ANOTHER SEASON: The very popular Mattara Carnival concluded on October 20 with Finals Day at Beresfield where five deciders were contested. See full report elsewhere in this issue.

NSW CLAIM ALLEY SHIELD: NSW claimed the Men's National sides championship last month winning all seven of their matches. It came down to the last match against 2022 conquerors Queensland and challengers New South Wales who were six wins without a blemish as the final round blockbuster ensued. The first match to conclude was a seesawing contest between the Aron Sherriff and Lee Schraner skipped rink. Sherriff's Queensland chargers of Nick Cahill, Sean Ingham and Wayne Turley OAM led for the majority of the matchup and took a 20-19 buffer into the final end against Schraner, Daniel Hill, Peter Taylor and Carl Healey, however the Blues were in complete control of the 21st end, leaving the three-time World Champion Sherriff with a mountain of work to do with his final delivery, which he was unable to impact with. Schraner then obliged to add in a fifth shot to the count and record a 24-20 victory and give New South Wales a handy advantage with two rinks to be completed. The Aaron Wilson skipped rink would also salute for New South Wales as they further extended their advantage with a 20-17 victory over Sean Baker's Queensland

quartet. With a buffer of seven, Ben Twist's rink would be able to breathe a little easier as his team was locked in a close encounter with Nathan Rice's Queensland team. After seeing results fall their way, all the New South Wales foursome needed were bowls in the area to avoid conceding a number to their northern rivals, enjoying a 16-15 victory to go undefeated for the entire campaign and sealing NSW their first Alley Shield since 2019. Taylor, Hill, Healey and Schraner would claim the overall best rink thanks to an unblemished tournament, in fact the NSW side only lost one rink by one shot for the entire series.

STATE ROOKIE PAIRS QUALIFIERS: Edgeworth's Karen and Sarah King, Charlestown's Scott Ellis and Joel Field along with Bruce Patchett and Stephen Woods from Nelson Bay have all qualified for the State rookie Pairs Finals later in the year. Field had also qualified for the State Rookie Singles earlier this year.

## VIEWPOINT

#### ABUSE OF OFFICIALS.

Volunteers such as Umpires and Controlling Bodies give up their time to ensure that our great game of Lawn Bowls is conducted in accordance with the relevant Laws and Policies which have been drawn up in the spirit of true sportsmanship.

Players are expected to conduct themselves in a polite and sporting like manner at all times.

The following **Bowls Australia Instantaneous Penalties Policy** can be imposed by the Umpire in consultation with the Controlling Body if a player commits an offence against them or another player: **2.1.** If an Umpire, by observation or on appeal by the Controlling Body, a side manager, a skip or an opponent, decides that a breach of any Law or Rule has taken place, or any action by a player (where there is no penalty specified in that Law or Rule) such as:

2.1.1. Acting in an abusive, threatening or intimidating manner;
2.1.2. Using obscene, offensive, abusive, threatening or intimidating language;

2.1.3. Threatening any person with physical violence or assault:

2.1.4. Assaulting any person has occurred.

Then the end shall be immediately regarded as completed and the opponent of the offender

shall be awarded as many shots as there are bowls in use by the opponent in a singles game,

or opposing team in a team game, or team in a side game.

Upon a second such offence by the same player in the same game, the player shall be excluded from taking any further part in that game according to the Laws of the Sport of Bowls -Crystal Mark Fourth Edition. C2 and C10 will apply.

Please Note: This only applies to an incident in a game of bowls. Other offences should be dealt with by the Club where the game is being played.

Hi Dreamers, continuing on with the 2023-24 Conditions of Play, I thought this month we will look at the conditions of play for the Singles and Pairs Rookie events with the State Finals of these to be held the first week of December at Raymond Terrace.

#### **Event Name NSW Rookies Championships**

Discipline Formats: There shall be two disciplines of NSW Rookies played: SINGLES, Players as four bowl per player. Each match shall be played as 17 shots up. Shots in excess of 17 do not count. PAIRS, Played as three bowls per player. In the order lead 3 bowls, skip 3 bowls. Each match shall be played over 12 ends.

Players Eligibility: Players must satisfy eligibility requirements as set out in General Conditions of Play. There are no gender requirements for NSW Rookies Championships. Players must not have been a bowling member of a club (anywhere in the World) before 1 April 2019 and must not played in more than one year of Rookies Competitions in previous years. (May have played in one year only of Rookies in 2019 or 2022-23) This date changes each year. Previous State Winners are ineligible to enter in that discipline.

Pairs Teams are not required to be from the same club. Members of Pairs teams are required to be registered with Clubs that are within the same Zone Boundaries.

Qualifying Play: Qualifying play shall be conducted at local qualifying venues. Qualifying play shall be conducted as a combination of sectional and knockout play. Trial Ends: No trial

Re-spotting the jack: If a jack in motion passes completely outside the boundaries of the rink or rebounds to a distance less than 18m from the mat line the end shall not be declared dead, but the jack re-spotted on the 2m mark.

State Finals: 32 Qualifiers for Singles and 32 Teams of Pairs will qualify for State Finals. A minimum of one qualifier from each Zone area (in singles and in pairs) will qualify for the State Finals. Additional places for State Finals will be allocated based on the number of entries received. State Finals will be conducted as a combination of sectional and knockout play.





# **BLOOD CLOTS / STROKE**

### They Now Have a Fourth Indicator, the Tongue

**STROKE:** Remember the 1st Three Letters.... S. T. R.

STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

During a BBQ, a woman stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) .she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes.

They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, Jane went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening Jane's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 pm Jane passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Jane would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

It only takes a minute to read this...

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough...

#### **RECOGNIZING A STROKE**


Thank You for the sense to remember the '3' steps, STR. Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S \*Ask the individual to SMILE.

T \*Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently)



(i.e. It is sunny out today.)

R\*Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number <u>immediately</u> and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

### New Sign of a Stroke ----- Stick out Your Tongue

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue.. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.

If every bowler in our districts learns how to tell a stroke victim, you can bet that at least one life will be saved.

I have done my part. Will you?
